This project is part of a current 4-year USDA-OREI grant. 130 broilers are currently being raised on pasture to be followed by tomatoes and cover-crops. This will be done multiple times over the next 4 years and we anticipate leveraging this OREI grant to help train beginning pastured poultry farmers as part of this BFRDP grant.
