The Pathways to Farming program seeks to support beginning farmers of color in the Pacific Northwest to launch their own agricultural businesses and to be a part of the creation of a regional farmer's cooperative. The program provides new growers with affordable land, resources, one-on-one guidance, and training to develop their production techniques and business skills. This program is specifically designed for people of color, including immigrants and refugees.

We are looking for 12 beginning farmers of color who meet the following criteria:

- Must have at least one year of hands-on farm production experience (i.e. growing for market, CSA, wholesale, homesteading, on-farm employment or internship, participation in Mudbone Grown training program, or similar training)
- Must have a clear farm business concept in mind
- Must be interested in working alongside other farmers of color and joining a regional network
- Must be interested in learning about local, State and Federal resources to help start or expand a farm business
- Can commit to participating in the program for 3 years.
- Can provide 2 references: 1 from a farmer and 1 from a community-based organization
- Can commit a minimum of 10 hours/week on farm + additional 4 hours/month community shift
